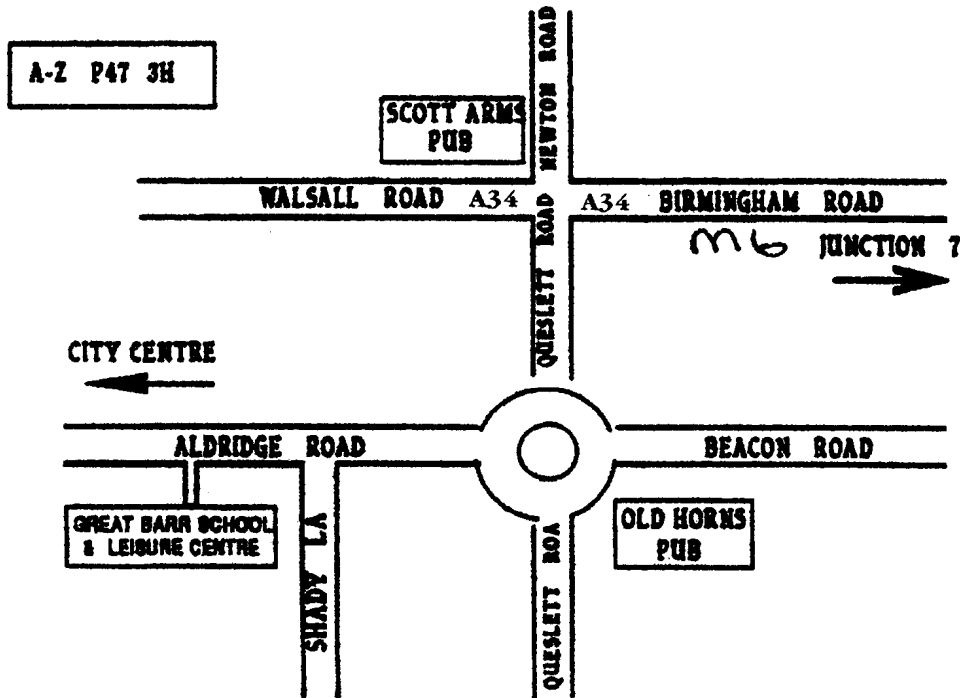


HOW TO FIND THE VENUE

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

1. In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
2. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
3. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
4. In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to & including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class ie. **15th June 2009**.
5. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special prize of whatever value.
6. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
 1. Withdrawal - the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.
 2. Transfer - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
7. If an exhibit arrives late & misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may NOT be transferred to any other class.

- MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.
- LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed
- OPEN:** For all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and which are eligible for entry at the Show.
- VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.
- BRACE:** For two exhibits (Either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace.

DEFINITIONS Contd.

SPEC BEGINNERS: Confined to Owner/Handler & Exhibit never having won a Challenge Certificate in the Breed. Dog must be handled by the Owner & the Owner must never have won a C.C. with any dog in the breed. An Owner/Handler having won a C.C. in wires may exhibit a Smooth or vice-versa, providing the other conditions are fulfilled.

NOT FOR COMPETITION:: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. **OPENING OF SHOW:** The Show will open at 9.30am
2. **ARRIVAL OF DOGS:** Dogs will be received until 11.00am, after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional & unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
3. **JUDGING TIME:** Judging will commence at 11.00am & exhibitors will be responsible for their dogs being on time for judging.
4. **REMOVAL OF DOGS:** Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **COOKING STOVES:** The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting & benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **ENTRY FEES:** Members £14.00 First entry each dog - Non-Members £18.00 First entry each dog. All subsequent classes £2.00. Junior Handler - £3.00 per class (dog must be entered in another class at this Show)
7. **PRIZE MONEY:** First £4.00 : Second £3.00 : Third £2.00 : Reserve £1.00 in all classes except Special Beginners . See further details in Show Information.
8. **REFUSAL OF ENTRIES:** The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. **PUPPIES:** Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. **MATING OF BITCHES:** The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed & is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed or Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION: Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed Classes and Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from ANY Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.

PROVISO: For the Purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed & is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from dogs beaten only by the dog declared Best in Show.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION: Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed Classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Rules & Regs Contd.

12. Contd.
- Dogs may be withdrawn from ANY Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
PROVISO: For the Purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. REGULATIONS: No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
15. PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION: All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. OVERSEAS EXHIBITORS: All dogs resident outside the UK MUST be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number BEFORE entry to the show/event made. All overseas entries withoutan Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- 1) When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - 2) If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - 3) The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - 4) Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - 5) When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - 6) Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so you dog stays well hydrated.
 - 7) Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

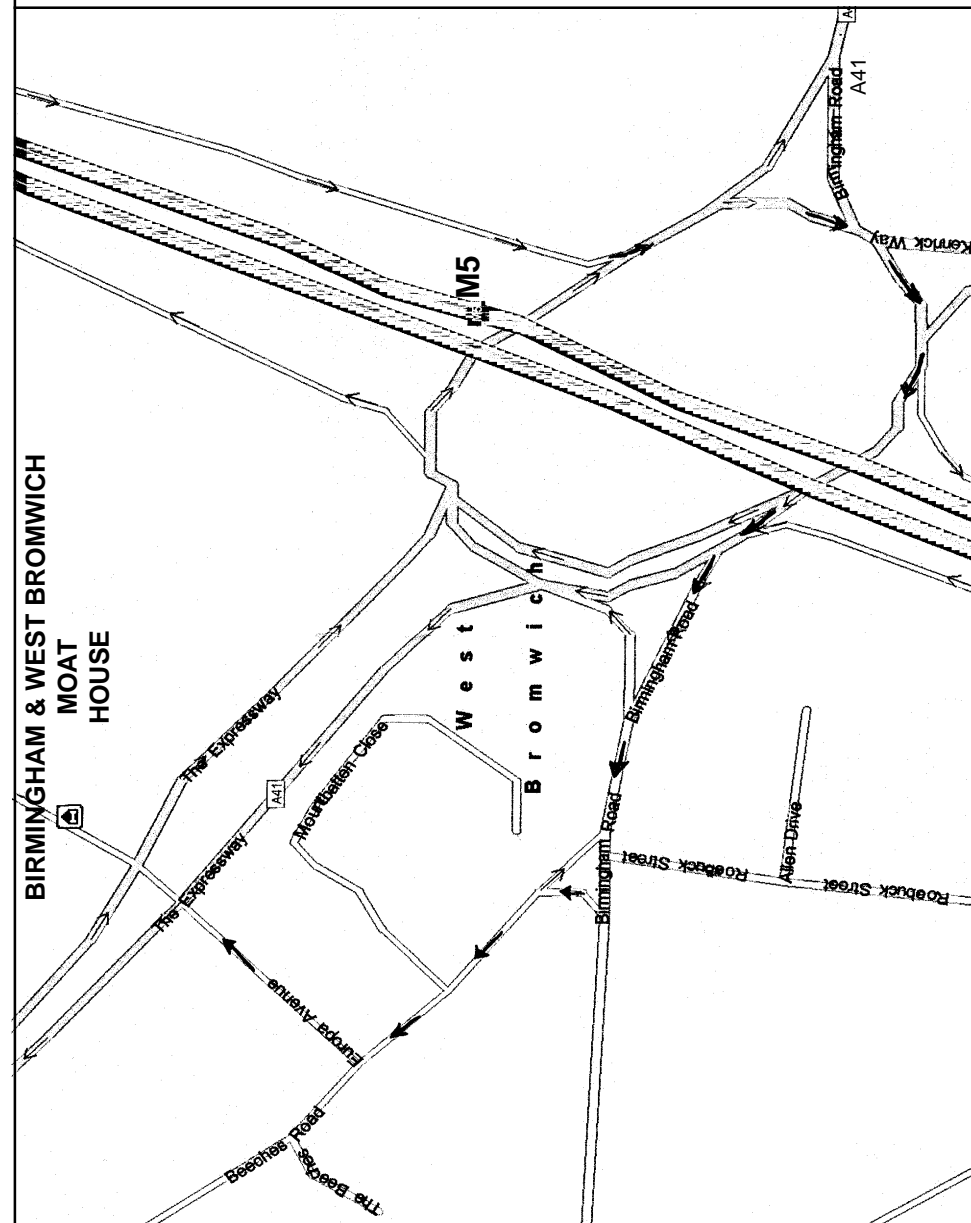
WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

18. NOT FOR COMPETITION: Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. DOG FOULING: Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog/s at any Kennel Club Licenced Show within the licenced venue & within the environs of that event including car & caravan parks & approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
20. RESPONSIBILITY: The Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any dog or other property whether arising from accident, or other cause whatever, or from any act of omission of itself, its officers, agents, servants or other, or damage done by the exhibits to any person or property.
21. EXCLUSION OF DOGS: If, in the opinion of the Secretary, Show Manager or any judge, any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the Show on the instruction of the Show Management.
22. REPLACEMENT OF JUDGES: If any judge is unable to fulfil an engagement, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a replacement. In these circumstances, exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees will be returned.
23. ALTERATIONS: An announcement prior to date of closing of entries in Our Dogs or Dog World of any alteration or addition to the Schedule or these Regulations shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
24. REGULATIONS F. F9 EXHIBITION OF DOGS:
- a) No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, car park and caravan parks and approaches.
 - b) The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car & caravan parks & approaches.

DIRECTIONS TO MOAT HOUSE HOTEL

Exit M5 at junction 1. From the South take the first exit off the roundabout into Birmingham Road (from the North go right round the roundabout) **DO NOT GET ON TO THE A41 EXPRESSWAY.** From Birmingham Road, take the first right hand turn into Beeches Road. Kennel Club Breeders Competition 2009

The following Awards are offered: **Best Breeder in Breed**
Best Breeder Group in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th
Grand Final at Crufts 2010



The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Twenty points are required to qualify for Finals at Crufts in the following year. Points are cumulative over a calendar year and are gained as follows:
 - Breed win 1 point
 - Fourth in Group 1 point
 - Third in Group 2 points
 - Second in Group 3 points
 - First in Group 4 points

Breeders gaining 20 points should apply to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club to apply for the Crufts Final. After amassing 20 points a breeder cannot enter any further Best Breeder Competitions for that calendar year.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATIONS OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations, he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A42.
2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from The Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by The Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
